Dear Peadar,

Following earlier conversation with Dolina MacIennan I wish to inform you that the A.G.M. of Comunn Gaidhlig na h-Eaglais Easbaigich met last night in Edinburgh and unanimously supported the National Plan for Gaelic.

We would however, strongly recommend the re-instatement of Gaelic religious service on Television and Radio.

As you may be aware, the Episcopal communion in Scotland was the chief supporter of the use of Gaelic in Scottish religion in the 17th and 18th Centuries, especially in translation of the Scriptures and Liturgical Services.

We would like this to be taken into account when Gaelic services are re-instated,
